On behalf of Lloyd International Honors College, you are invited to submit a paper for possible inclusion in the inaugural spring issue of *Y Ddraig Goch: An Interdisciplinary Honors Journal*. The theme of this call is **Innovations in Pedagogy, Research, and Learning**.¹

Y Ddraig Goch: An Interdisciplinary Honors Journal is published by Lloyd International Honors College of The University of North Carolina at Greensboro. The journal aims to provide a platform for interdisciplinary research at the undergraduate level, and book reviews. Submissions on all topics are welcome, although preference will be given to submissions relating to the theme.

Call Paper Timetable:

Timely submission of the papers is critical to the success of the program. The procedures and timetable enumerated below will apply.

Deadline for Papers

1. *Submission Guidelines*

For a submission to be considered, you must be granted permission by a faculty mentor. The name, department, and email of the Faculty mentor must be included.

Papers must be no more than 1200-4500 words. Authors will be required to execute a “Permission to Publish” form, which formally grants us permission to publish the paper.

Please include a cover page: title; author's name(s) as should appear in publication; name of department/program of study; abstract (300 words max). In general, your submission might include sections for an Abstract, Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion, References, and Figures/Tables. Please use APA citation style. Writing

should be clear, logical, and free from typographical or grammatical errors. You are responsible for copyediting your submission. **Submission Deadline is January 9th 2017**

2. *Acceptance of Paper*

By **February 6th 2017**, the Editorial Board will make a decision on all papers. The number of accepted papers might be limited. The Editorial Board will contact authors regarding the status of their papers. Abstracts, and papers will be double-blind peer reviewed and judged by students and faculty. Accepted papers will be published in the

Y Ddraig Goch: An Interdisciplinary Honors Global Journal. The Committee will determine which papers are published in the Journal. The Committee reserves the right to not publish a submission.

3. *Prize Competition*

All papers submitted and accepted in response to the call and meeting the minimum standards established by the Committee will be included in the **Red Dragon** Competition. A prize fund of **\$100** is available for one paper submitted in response to the call. The criteria for evaluation will reflect:

- Originality of ideas;
- Clarity of presentation;
- Thorough treatment of those ideas.

The Committee looks forward to receiving proposals in response to the call, and is happy to respond to inquiries from interested parties.
